

Guidelines for the Establishment of the Chung Yuan Christian University Environmental Protection and Occupational Safety and Health Committee

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Article 1 To promote environmental protection and occupational safety and health on campus, the university establishes the "Environmental Protection and Occupational Safety and Health Committee" (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") in accordance with the Environmental Protection Act and the Occupational Safety and Health Act.

Article 2 The Committee shall consist of 15 to 25 members. The university president shall serve as the chairperson and convener. Ex officio members include the Director of the Environmental Protection and Occupational Safety and Health Center, the Dean of Student Affairs, the Dean of the College of Science, the Dean of the College of Engineering, the Dean of the College of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, and the Dean of the College of Design. Other members shall be appointed by the president from among faculty members with relevant expertise and labor representatives of the university, with a term of one year.

Article 3 The Committee's duties include evaluating, discussing, planning, and supervising the following matters related to applicable areas within the university:

1. Formulating regulations on environmental protection and occupational safety and health management.
2. Addressing environmental protection and occupational safety and health management issues assigned by the chairperson.
3. Establishing regulations related to environmental protection and occupational safety and health for laboratories, testing facilities, experimental workshops, and testing workshops.
4. Establishing campus pollution prevention regulations.
5. Managing the hazard prevention of mechanical and electrical equipment, materials, chemical substances, biological materials, and radioactive materials.
6. Conducting personnel education, training, and health management for laboratories, testing facilities, experimental workshops, and testing workshops.
7. Other related matters.

Article 4 The Committee shall convene once every three months, with extraordinary meetings held as necessary.

Article 5 A meeting may be convened only with the attendance of more than half of the members. Decisions shall require the approval of more than half of the attending members.

Article 6 These guidelines shall take effect upon approval by the Administrative Meeting and promulgation by the president. The same procedure applies to any amendments.
